If you don't know about the virus and the need to protect yourself, your living under a rock : ). So, I'm sure our Snowbirds are fully aware of the risk and have been taking many of the same precautions we have. After all, we are all in the same high risk group, 55+++.

We are asking all residents and returnees to protect themselves whenever they are out and about. If you cannot or did not, please use a mask or social distance when you return home to Covered Bridge.

If you're sick, for any reason, please stay home and/or seek medical attention as needed.

If you're self-quarantined and need some assistance, please give one of us a call, there is always a friend or neighbor willing to help and that is why, we love living in Covered Bridge!

Social Distancing or a mask are effective in limiting the spread in social settings. Please use them if you suspect you're at risk of spreading the virus.

If you have been out and about, please think about where you have been (your exposure). i.e. have you been involved in some at risk activities, exposed to someone who was diagnosed with covid-19 or was ill. If any of the above is yes, social distance yourself or wear a mask for 10-14 days after the exposure.

As we progress or should I say, as the virus progresses, we will learn more and adjust our plans/opinions. I still believe we need to remain somewhat conservative and to watch and learn from others as they increase their exposure.
