HIGHLIGHTS FROM HOA MEETING, AUGUST 16, 2022

There were two new residents, Cathie and Dave Fouche, introduced themselves and were warmly welcomed.

A correction re: "Divine Ice Cream truck hours are Tuesdays, 2-4:30 p.m."

Tom Taylor thanked Leigh Russ for her courteous yet frustrating handling of the overdue maintenance accounts. Her patience with the residents' circumstances continues. Four property liens fall into this category.

Tom Taylor reminded us that in these stressful days, people are quick to anger and negative thoughts, so we need to find good solutions for all concerned. He pointed out that the Board appreciates accurate reports that uncover problems in Covered Bridge with facts that may be investigated. He referred to two problems here, the propane tank and the neighbor issue. We pride ourselves by respecting the opinions and choices of others. He feels that our community looks are good overall by:

- Not parking on the grass
- Parking RVs for three days only
- Putting trash out on Monday nights.

Patty Hynes reported that the many calls about Jack Creek (watershed) have been made to the county, state, federal agencies, and the Southwest Florida Water Management District have stalled. Herman Bott added that some time ago all parties denied responsibility regarding Jack Creek. Patty Hynes will keep calling. Those residents living along the creek have received letters from the water district which will be investigated.

OLD BUSINESS

Pool - Tom Taylor has been waiting for replies from pool vendors. He's still looking for an expert.

Liens - As mentioned earlier, the four liens, next step is the attorney.

Roads - Cliff Hangley reported that last Friday a core sample was taken by the interested asphalt company. We are waiting for the report. If bedrock under the road is good, it will cost less to repair. They will start on Pinecrest and continue down Venetian to the clubhouse first.

NEW BUSINESS

Clubhouse - Tom Taylor noted that the noisy air conditioner clutch needs to be replaced.

Architectural Committee - Ron Colbert reported that two requests have been approved; three are pending.

Buildings/Grounds - Tom Taylor reported no major issues, but we are getting estimates for a improved sprinkler system. He reminded us that the Board of Architectural Committee should be contacted so that any suggested changes can be explored.

Compound - Gene Fischer reported that the compound is in good condition except for the damaged gate.

Neighborhood Watch - no current report. The new signs are supposed to discourage vandalism. Tom Taylor reminded us to keep our eye on our neighbors' prop-

erty. Patty Hynes also reminded us to call 911, **NOT** Neighborhood Watch or HOA Board members if you are unsure of the seriousness of a situation. They will gladly check it out. You may see more Sheriff citizen Patrol cars patrolling Covered Bridge.

Social - Cindy Hubble thanked those few who showed up for workday. A lot was accomplished.
