

HIGHLIGHTS OF MAY 17, 2022 HOA BOARD MEETING

Tom thanked everyone for looking after the houses of folks gone north. Be careful if using someone else's driveway, respect the property line.

Trash was picked up at 7:15 a.m., so many people missed the Tuesday morning pick up. The cans were not put out because of the bears. Trash company said they will start picking up at 7:00 a.m.

Tom discouraged confronting folks coming through the **bridge illegally**. Notify the police with license plate numbers. A resident suggested a residential sticker to put on windshields. It will be discussed.

Leigh Russ reported info from our **financial advisor** that we have a small loss and suggest making no changes at this time. Motion passed to follow advisors' recommendation.

HC Waterworks sent letters to many, and Tom got a call from a senator to discuss the issue. Postcards are here, available at the office to send to let them know what we want and to fix the problem with noise and the smell.

The language in the **Gatorco** contract will be updated to show they will be paid \$150.00 for gas over \$3.50 a gallon for each month.

Pool motor was repaired by Tom Taylor and Tom Wacker. Water is clear and beautiful now.

Pig trap was removed because of residents walking around it.

Motion was approved for the colors chosen to be used for base and trim **colors for homes**.

Propane tanks must be buried by a professional.

At least 6 residents have made plans to put **solar panels** on their roof. Motion approved.

Discussion about a **daughter living here**, under the age of 55, and no owner over 55 living in the home. She was told in writing and face to face that she is not allowed. Attorney is handling it.

Regarding **166 Woodside**, owners have left, owe money in arrears, and is owned by a reverse mortgage. A lien is being placed on the property. Lawyer is finding owner of property.

There is a **\$10.00 late charge** for maintenance fees. Discussion about adding fines when **rules are not being followed.** Leigh Russ and Patty Hynes will work on the rules for the next meeting.

Investigation started into cost of **painting** outside of **Clubhouse** and patching gutters.

Architectural Committee – Six request approved.

Grounds – Complaints about burning leaves on the creek.

Compound – New wheels on the gate.

Neighborhood Watch – Bob Evans stated inmates said one of the biggest deterrents for stealing is signs stating there is protection. **Pool** – Tom Taylor thanked Glenda Fluckey for scrubbing the pool and getting rid of the algae. Diane Granson will be watching the pool through the summer, and Tom Taylor will help.

Memorial Day – Bobbie Snow said to bring a dish to pass, meet at the flagpole, sing patriotic songs, and games will be played inside.

Bobbie Snow discussed **outside visitors** coming in and using our facilities.

Tom Taylor asked for anyone in the community that has a **complaint**, let the Board know through a phone call or email before the meeting.


