COVERED BRIDGE ASSOCIATION HOA BOARD MEETING DECEMBER 20, 2022

The December meeting of the Board of Directors of the Covered Bridge Association, Lake placid, Florida, met in the Clubhouse, Tuesday, December 20, 2022, at 10:00 a.m.

Secretary Rick Kennedy publicly thanked Claire Leffler for serving so well as the interim Secretary for the past seven months and Joanne Novelli for typing up the Secretary's minutes and inserting them in the monthly Echoes newsletter. The minutes of the November 2022 meeting were approved.

Treasurer Leigh Russ presented the Treasurer's Report, which showed a balance of \$76,284.66 in the operating account. The

Tom Taylor thanked all of those involved in the last workday and then read and commented on numerous items submitted through our suggestion box. Tom commented on and complimented Treasurer Leigh Russ for the extensive and high-quality work in her area.

OLD BUSINESS

Discussion about hiring a company to make road repairs and staying within our \$20,000 budget. Cindy Hubbel motioned to approve, and Leigh Russ seconded the motion, to patch the roads staying under the \$20,000 budget. Motion carried.

Tom addressed concerns about liens on numerous properties that were behind in their fees or in need of serious upgrading. The board will continue to attempt recoup the funds and push for improvements in those properties designated.

The Clubhouse lawn repair/sprinkler proposal of \$4,000, earmarked for improving the lawn and its appearance on the west side, was

discussed. Cindy Hubbel motioned to approve, and Patty Hynes seconded the motion to move forward with the plan. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Cliff Hangley made a motion to provide \$2,700 to \$3,000, to build concrete pads beside the pickle ball courts for bases of a cornhole court. Tom Wacker seconded the motion. However, it would require a change in the budget. The motion carried and the development of permanent cornhole court will progress.

Several board members discussed Tom Taylor's proposal to change our HOA billing from monthly to quarterly. No action was taken. It will appear under old business at the next meeting.

Tom Taylor and Cindy Hubbel explained the need for and the purchase/installation of two new kitchen stoves that are now in the building and ready for use.

With the yearly board election coming up at the end of the year, President Taylor asked each of the three candidates to introduce themselves. The candidates are Cindy Hubbel, Gavin Walls, and Sue Lily. It was announced that the annual homeowners meeting would be January 2, at 2:00 p.m., following the new board member elections.

Tom Taylor stated the board would be taking more aggressive action against unsightly properties and those with carports containing junk.

Patty Hynes announced the new phone books would be out soon.

Patty Hynes has also been in frequent contact with Duke Energy about the streetlight at US-27 and Lake Francis Road, as well as streetlights in Covered Bridge that are not working.

COMMITTEES

Tom Wacker reported on improvements and repairs recently completed and announced new street signs for Juniper Street.

Cliff Hangley reported plenty of spaces in the compound.

Frank Brown gave a good report on the pool.

Jim Moore explained several pool improvements he has been investigating, including night lighting and use, as well as estimated costs for a new enlarged pool and/or hot tub.

Bob Evans reported on new signs and sign replacements in the community.

Cindy Hubbel listed the many activities coming up in the next few months, and their dates.

RESIDENT COMMENTS

Henry Preuss encouraged the board to look for many available grants to help with funding of particularly large projects.

Jim Stanton suggested that any new sprinkler system heads be installed with flexible connections.

Jim Moore listed many items he had observed that needed repair in the community and encouraged the board to tackle those before the repair bill is huge.

Elaine Orr talked about the details for some of the upcoming dances.

With no other business to come before the board and the time approaching 12:00 p.m., Cliff Hangley made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Patty Hynes seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
